

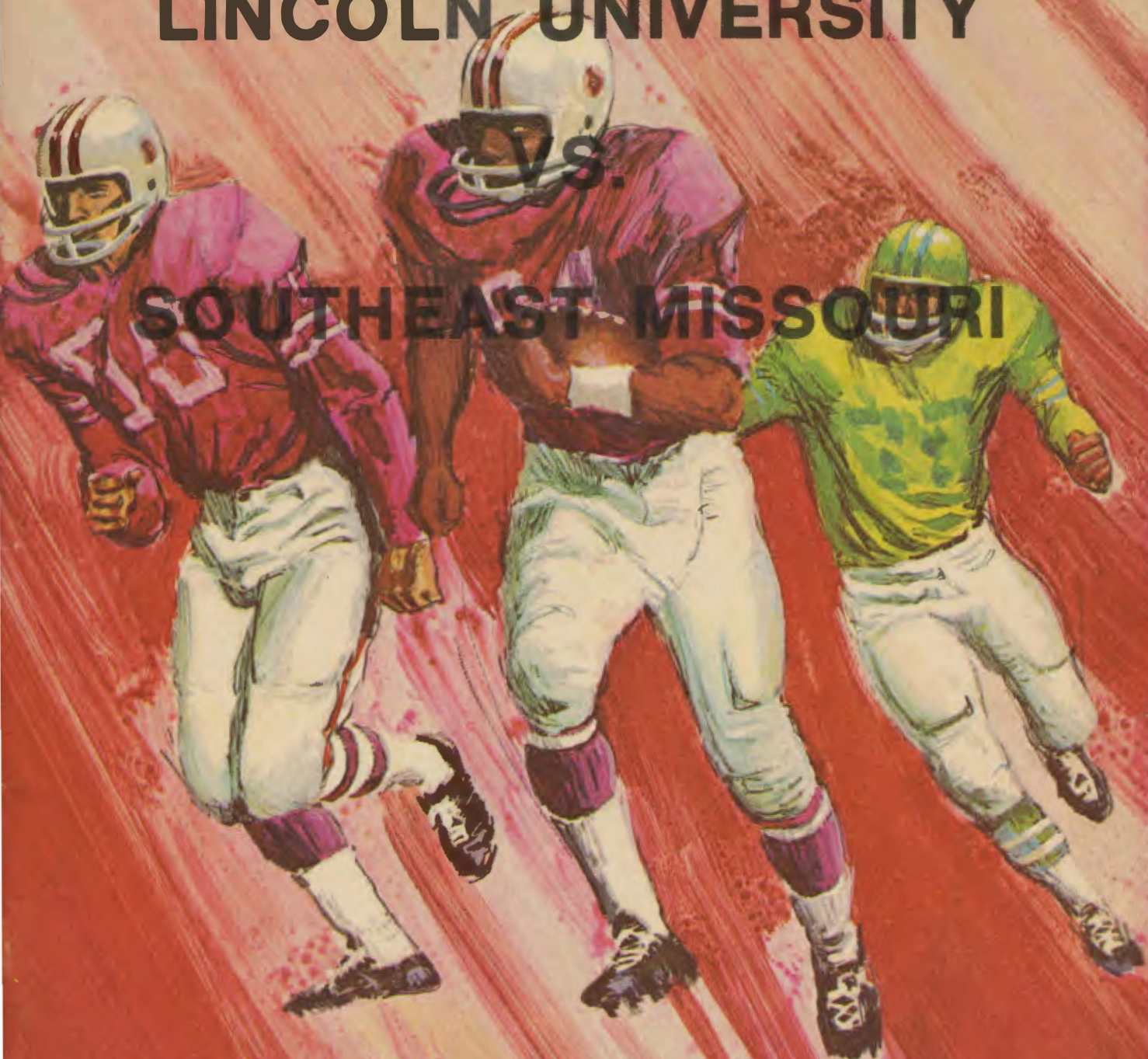

Tigers Close Home Slate Today

Welcome back to Lincoln! It's Homecoming 1975. Squeezed in between all the hoopla of parties, receptions and old acquaintances is today's football game. That game figures to be one of the most exciting events of the weekend.

The Tigers opponent is a formidable one, Southeast Missouri. The Indians boast of a 4-0 conference record (5-4 overall) and are tied for the league lead with Northeast Missouri.

The Tigers, meanwhile, have won only three games all season. One of those came two weeks ago when Lincoln beat conference rival Missouri-Rolla for their lone MIAA win.

If history repeats itself today, Coach Leo Lewis' squad will be in for a rough afternoon. The Indians are the only team in the MIAA that holds an edge over the Tigers in series battles. Southeast has beaten LU four times and lost only once since the Tigers entered the MIAA in 1970.

Southwest Missouri beat the Tigers last week, 41-14, while Southeast was downing Central Missouri, 31-6.

Against Southwest last week, the Tigers were the victims of their own mistakes. The visiting Bears turned three LU fumbles and a blocked punt in touchdowns. Only twice did the Bears control the football. Both drives resulted in field goals.

Mike West, sophomore wide receiver from Chicago, Ill., was the star of the game, however. He scored both Tiger TD's. The first came on a 53-yard pass play from Mike Scales and the second came on a dazzling 25-yard reverse. West also caught five passes for 99 yards and returned a kickoff 66 yards.

In the last two games, West has returned five kickoffs for 202 yards —

an average of 40.4 yards per return, tops in the conference.

The Tigers will need some big plays today to stop the Indians. Although the Tigers had their best day of the season passing the football last week, their offense has been hot-and-cold at best. Southeast has one of the league's best defenses (along with LU) and has shutoff potent offensive teams like Northwest Missouri, Central Missouri and Southwest Missouri.

Southwest scored only three points against the Indians in contrast to the 41-point total they ran up against Lincoln last week.

Offensively, the Indians have ridden the arm of quarterback Rick Wieser. The senior signal-caller missed the early season with a hand injury. SEMO, however, hasn't lost since having Wieser back at the controls.

His favorite target has been receiver Terry Slattery but the Indians haven't had to pass a lot recently. Bobby Everage, Jack Gokin and Anthony Wallace have been the reason. The three running backs have combined for over 950 yards rushing this season, more than all of Lincoln's running backs combined.

Defensively, the Tigers rate as Southeast's equals. While Lincoln has given up 183 points, most of those have been set up by offensive mistakes. The defensive charge is led by tackle Jerald Brown, backed up by linebacker Larry Terry and supported further by safety Bruce Johnson. All three have been all-MIAA selections in the past.

For Terry and Johnson, today is their last game in an LU uniform before the home fans. That should be plenty of incentive for a hard-fought battle today.

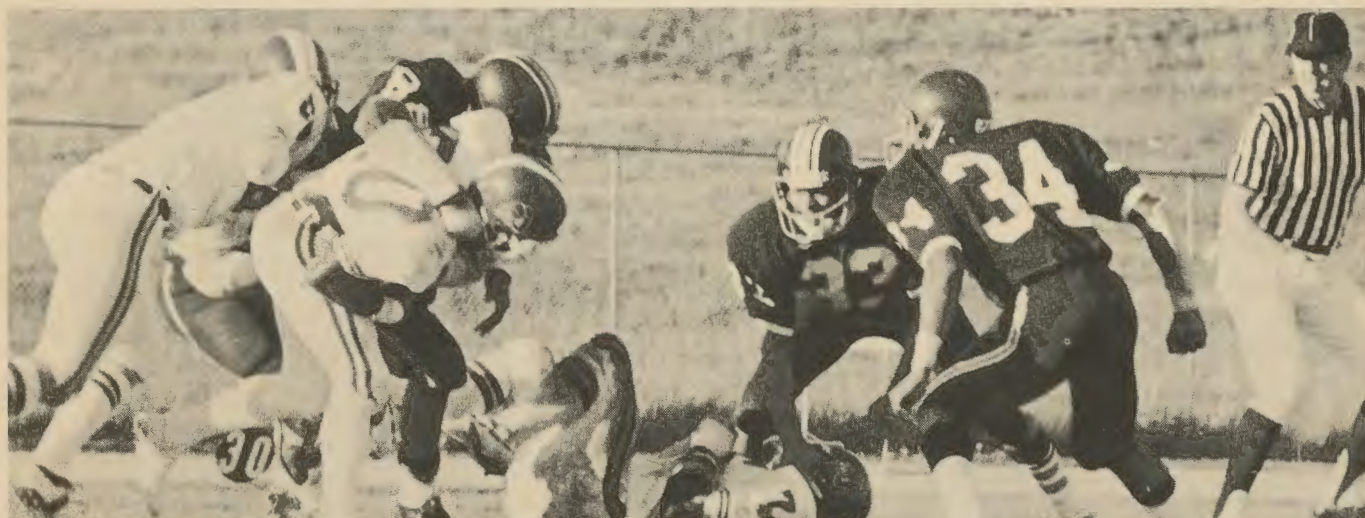
