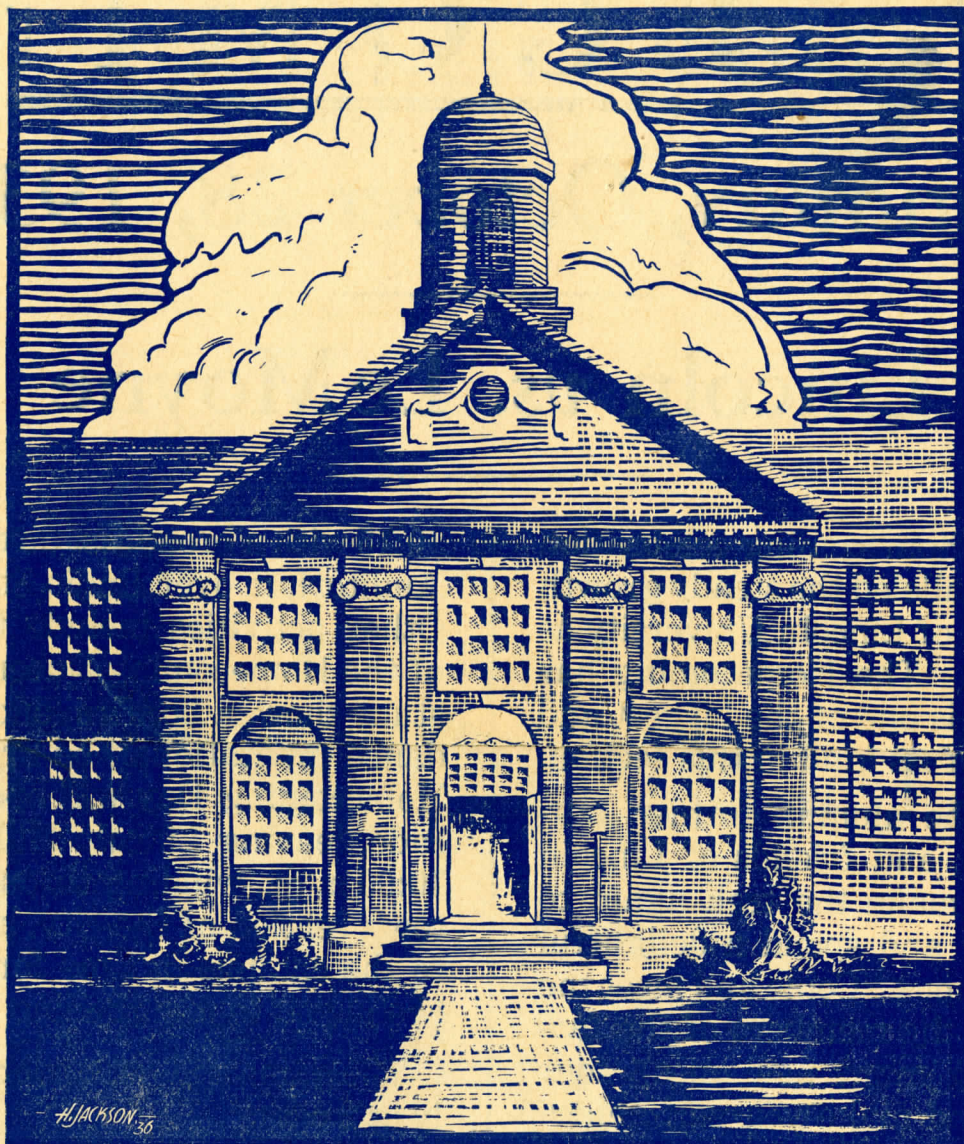

The Lincoln Homecoming is a stand-out athletic and social event of the middle west. Last year's event was attended by people not only from every part of Missouri, but from a number of states, including such distant ones as Indiana and Colorado. This year everything points to a record Homecoming crowd. We know you will want to be present and greet your old friends.

The pre-Homecoming events begin Thursday morning, October 26th, at

10:15 with a broadcast direct from Page Auditorium over Radio Station KWOS. Other activities include the crowning of the Homecoming Queen, a collegiate stunt show, a bonfire, and a fraternity dance (invitational) on Friday evening. Homecoming Day will open with a parade, leaving Lincoln Hill promptly at 10:00 a. m., winding through the downtown section of the city, and returning to the campus in time for lunch. You are urged to join the line of march.

The game will get under way promptly at 2 p. m.

Following the evening meal, a first-run picture will be shown in Page Auditorium.

At 9 p. m. an outstanding orchestra will furnish music for the annual Homecoming Dance in the gymnasium.

Housing facilities are being increased, guide service will be provided, and reasonable comforts are assured. Pass the news on to your friends and help make the 1939 Homecoming the greatest yet.

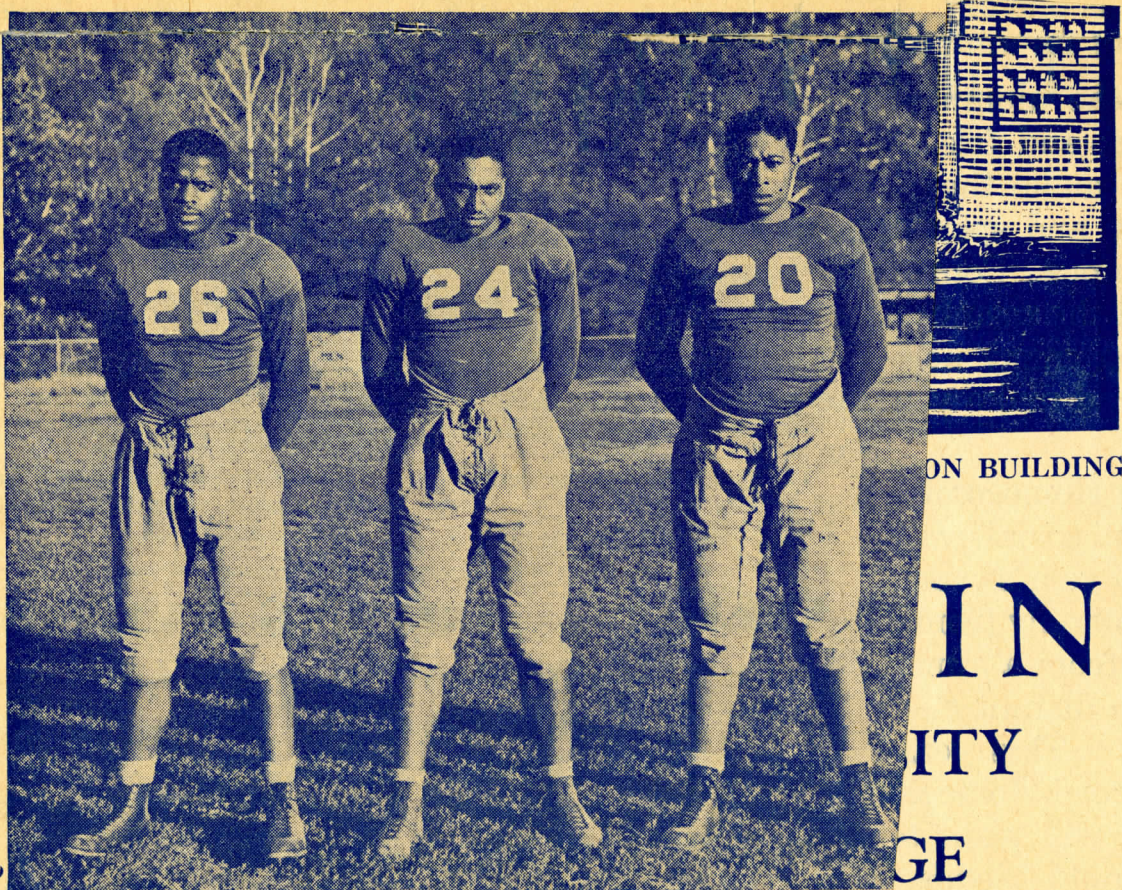
